



NCLB community agreement - Training specification

Background

Partners in Cheltenham come together to work collectively to address issues of child poverty in Cheltenham under the banner of [No Child Left Behind](#). Partners delivered a year of action in 2019 which culminated in an awards event in January 2020.

To progress NCLB in 2020, partners have developed a [community agreement](#) which is a commitment to making sure that services across our town are delivered with kindness at their core, taking into account families' individual circumstances and experiences. The agreement is determined to play a part in creating a brighter future for the children and young people in Cheltenham, and ensures that no child is left behind.

To date 50 organisations in Cheltenham have signed up including 21 schools and 29 organisations.

As we want the community agreement to live and breathe in the working practices of our signatories, we want to commission a range of training packages that will enable signatories to learn together – in order that we help build a strong and empowered network of organisations.

The request

We want to make training available to cover the following topics.

- Resilience
- Trauma informed
- Kindness
- Restorative practices
- Wellbeing
- Self-care
- Inclusion / equity / equality
- Engagement
- Poverty

The training will be delivered in an online format via a 2 hour interactive training session and will be open to all signatories – up to 50 organisations.

The training provider must ensure the course content and delivery is relevant and actively grows the potential of the network of signatories. We want the training to stimulate debate and an enthusiasm to go back to their organisations and change working practices – with the support of other participants.

Giving participants the confidence and ability to make changes within their organisations will be a key part of the training.

We don't anticipate all the training being delivered by just one provider, so are looking for range of training providers to work with us to provide this training

The training provider should also allow time within the 2 hours to enable discussion and debate on the subject matter to help build a collective response to the subject matter and that all participants feel supported.

To ensure that there is a legacy, the training provider is also requested to supply a separate supporting video that will be hosted on the NCLB website and accessible to signatories. To protect copyright material, this will only be available to signatories.

Training providers interested in being part of the No Child Left Behind Community Agreement should submit a costed proposal.

We will then evaluate each submission against the following criteria

- Price
- Understanding of the brief
- Quality of proposed method statement
- Quality of previous work
- Other added value
